Akron Art Prize, sponsored by The Margaret Clark Morgan Foundation and brought to you by Downtown Akron Partnership, is a new and exciting addition to Akron's art scene. More than 120 artists will show their works in four spaces between Sept. 7 and Oct. 5, during which time the public will vote to determine the winner of a \$5,000 grand prize and five \$1,000 runner-up awards.




Votes for Akron Art Prize are cast using SMS (text-to-vote) technology. Guests ages 16 and over may register to vote with their smart phones (see pg 4).



The Artist as Entrepreneur Institute (AEI) is designed to provide

individual artists with the necessary tools for becoming economically sustainable in their own regard.

AEI is set up as a multi-session, 24-hour course of study. The program covers topics that impact an artist's daily operations, from selecting an incorporation model to marketing to writing a business plan. On the first day, participants are provided with a resource book that includes support materials on each of the topic areas covered in the program. Throughout the program, participants interact with professional practitioners from business areas including art, law, marketing, research and accounting. Session formats are varied and include a mix of lectures, panels, group discussions and practical exercises.

This program is collaboratively funded by the Burton D. Morgan Foundation and The Margaret Clark Morgan Foundation in support of regional artists in our community.


